# READING THE BIBLE (AGAIN) FOR THE FIRST TIME

A FOUR WEEK ALL ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS BEGINNING OCTOBER 20TH AT 9:45 A.M. IN THE FELLOWSHIP HALL

Reading the Bible Again For the First Time: Taking the Bible Seriously But Not Literally is the title of a book by Professor and Author Marcus Borg. It is also the title for our fall all Adult Sunday School beginning October 20<sup>th</sup> at 9:45 in the Fellowship Hall. It is scheduled to be a four week study but could be extended if we find it necessary. I hope you will plan to attend this study even if you have not attended in a while or never attended Sunday School.

The world's bestselling, most-read, and most-loved book is also one of the most confusing. Many Christians mistakenly believe that their only choice is either to reconcile themselves to a fundamentalist reading of scripture (a "literal-factual" approach) or to simply reject the Bible as something that could bring meaning and value into their lives. During our time together we will rethink how we read the Bible and the importance of the Bible for our living.

Together we will look at the importance of scripture for our spiritual and daily lives. We will look at how to take the Bible seriously, but not literally, and the importance of reading the Bible for both study and devotion. We will examine how both the Old and New Testaments were formed. We will also look at the many translations and paraphrases of the Bible over several centuries and what sources we have today that those in earlier translations did not have.

We will attempt to address some of the hot-button issues that plague the church and cultural debate, and try to answer many of the questions frequently asked by Christians and non-Christians alike. Did God really command Moses to put gay people to death? Did Jesus really teach that everyone who is not a Christian will be assigned to hell? Why would Paul command women to "keep silent in the church?" Were Adam and Eve real people? Is the book of Revelation really about the end times?

The United Church of Christ has two wonderful slogans "God is still speaking," and "Never place a period where God has placed a comma." I believe the Bible is God's comma, not period to the world. It speaks to us in different ways in every generation. Come and share and learn more about God's comma - the Bible - beginning October 20<sup>th</sup>.


